To type a character in blue, hold down the Alt key on the right side of the keyboard and then type the appropriate key.

Alternate: To type an accented character, first press the accent key (to the left of Enter), then type the appropriate vowel.

Alternate: To type a “u” with a dieresis (ü), hold down the shift key, press the accent key, then type the letter “u”.

Alternate: To type an “n” with a tilde (ñ), hold down the shift key, press the tilde key (to the left of 1), then type the letter “n”.

Red keys indicate a second keystroke is necessary before a character will appear.
